



Dr. Bryan McKinley Jones Brayboy (Lumbee) is Borderlands Professor of Indigenous Education and Justice in the School of Social Transformation at Arizona State University (ASU). At ASU, he is director of the Center for Indian Education and coeditor of the *Journal of American Indian Education*. He also has affiliations with the Mary Lou Fulton Teachers College, American Indian Studies, and the Department of English. From 2007 to 2012, he was Visiting President's Professor of Indigenous Education at the University of Alaska Fairbanks. His research focuses on the experiences of indigenous students, staff, and faculty

in institutions of higher education, indigenous knowledge systems, culturally responsive schooling, and indigenous research methodologies. He has authored numerous publications, including a recently published manuscript titled *Education for American Indian and Alaska Natives: Education for Nation Building and Self-Determination* (Wiley Jossey-Bass).
