LaVoy attended high school in Mahnomen and graduated from Concordia College in 1988 with a B.S. in English education and a minor in French. She worked as a Title VII tutor with the Mahnomen School District and then took an English teaching position at the Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig School. LaVoy returned to White Earth and worked as a curriculum developer for the Mahnomen School District.

LaVoy has served as the director of Education for 14 years. She has served on parent committees and was a member of the Minnesota Indian Scholarship Program Committee and the Minnesota Indian Education Committee. LaVoy currently sits on the American Indian Advisory Council for the University of Minnesota Morris, the American Indian Advisory Board for St. Cloud State University, and the Minnesota State University Moorhead Indian Education Council. She also serves as the vice-chair of the Tribal Nations Education Committee. LaVoy is the proud mom of six: Gene, student—UMD; Sidney—U.S. Army, Fort Riley, Kansas; Sarah—high school senior; Wayne—eighth grade; Samuel—fifth grade; and James—fourth grade.
